Dear Lower Elwha Tribal Community Members,

Happy New Year!! I hope and pray that everyone had a safe and Happy New Year!! It seems that time goes by so fast. Once again the council authorized a Christmas benefit for our members. I hope that you enjoyed Christmas and New Year's. I am proud of how our tribe takes care of our members and each other.

We tribes have another four tough years ahead of us with the new administration. We will have to keep our head down and keep going. We survived the first four years. I am worried about it though. The administration is not a rookie anymore. This administration now knows how to move things in a timely manner and has experience. That can't be good for us tribes. But we are Strong People and will get through this.

You may have noticed all the construction around streams replacing culverts. That's because the tribes sued Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) over fish blocking culverts. The court said WSDOT has to replace fish blocking culverts. Now WSDOT is telling the tribes they can't meet the court mandate regarding the time line to achieve the goal. The reason is the WSDOT claims they have no funds. We tribes are working to ensure the court mandate is upheld or at least figure out and when it can be done. I've attended a lot of meetings over this issue both with the tribes and state, together and separately. Not all tribes are in agreement and it gets complicated. I sit in the construction zones and can't get mad because it is for our salmon.

I have been attending the Region 10


Tribal Operations Committee with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) officials. We work on natural resource issues. I represent Western Washington State tribes. From there I am also participating on the National Tribal Caucus. At this level I represent EPA's Region 10 at the national level talking about all the issues in Region 10. Region 10 consists of Washington, Oregon, Idaho tribes and Alaskan Native Villages. Of course I am not the only representative. There are several of us serving on the committees and councils. I take this work very seriously as it affects our tribe.

We have just started the Pacific Salmon and Pacific Fisheries Management Council negotiations. We go through this every year. It takes up to four months to get it done. We tribes have to come to an agreement within ourselves and we have to come to an agreement with our co-managers, the State of Washington. Sometimes it can get quite contentious. Everyone is trying to protect what we perceive as ours. Elwha's fishing fleet used to be large, fishing for Sockeye, Coho and Chum. Now we just fish in the Hood Canal. Imagine that, Chum used to be the gravy fishery in the canal. We would move from the straits to the Hood Canal. It was a fun time of year. Now it is our mainstay. I have been pushing the state to stop harvesting Chum in the canal using purse sein vessels. They go in there and it looks like a city. The state did reduce the number of seiners but I feel that is not enough. When the seiners leave, it takes two to three days for the fish to return. Plus the seiners make sure they are present during the peak of the run. Even the Washington State Gillnetters agree that the purse seiners don't need to be there. I will keep doing what Billy Frank Jr always told us, "Tell Your Story."

Paddle to Elwha 2025 is fast approaching. What an exciting time! We have Sammy Sampson's land assignment cleared and getting ready to construct a 200 foot by 200 foot steel building. We hired a geotech firm to help determine where the best spot to put the building. To put the size into perspective, the Puyallup tent for last year's journey was 100 feet by 100 feet. This building will also be used for other tribal events and maybe casino events. I can't wait to see how it will look. Lower Elwha Tribe takes pride in how our buildings look. I would like to look for funding to have a new administration building. Council agreed to hire a Canoe Journey Coordinator. I am not quite sure where that is at. We had a few that applied but they were nontribal. I suggested that we perform a lateral move from within our employees. Anyway.... More to come.

Once again, thank you for taking the time to read my letter. Thank you for all your support over the years.






Celebrate the Legacy of Martin Luther King Jr.





2024 Highlights:

2024 was one of many busy years for staff as they continue implementing the OVW FY2022 grant for the second year while gaining and losing staff. LEFA staff have provided multiple community events and awareness/outreach to inform and educate individuals about the LEFA program services, gave tools to stay safe, connected and engaged. Below are highlights:

About 11 newsletter articles. Thank you to Chrissi Ducotey for accepting, editing and publishing my articles.

February – National Teen Dating Awareness Month – Teen Dance ""Night Under the stars -Åča?áwəł tə tiya?táwsəna?" with middle school students.

April - National Sexual Assault Awareness Month. Staff tied teal ribbons at LEKT facilities, garbage picked up from Elwha River Casino to Tribal Center; gave away vegetable seeds to commemorate the World Earth Day awareness; Special Teal drink at Cedar Box as promo and awareness.

May - Remembered MMIWP with awareness walk and ceremony in honored of few family members of MMIWP.

June - Assisted at Pride Walk – LGBTQ+ event. Two staff attended the Inter-Tribal Working Group meeting in Tulalip, WA. Outreach at End of School Barbeque.

August – Beatriz attended and provided outreach at Quileute New Beginning Take Back the Night DV/SA awareness.

September – participated in "Walk a Mile in Her Shoes" with Healthy Families of Clallam County. One staff attended the MMIWP summit in Ferndale, WA; other staff participated at the 2024 Annual WSCADV – Washington State Coalition Against Domestic Violence Conference in Yakima, WA, where she was elected as a Board of member of WSCADV. The WomenSpirit Coalition donated worth of \$5,000 for events and victims' emergency supplies.

October – "Breaking the Silence – <u>ča?x</u>w<u>áyu st</u> <u>ca samíxwtxw "of</u> Domestic violence awareness walk was facilitated with partners. Becca, Nancy, Jimmy and Beatriz received awards from WomenSpirit Coalition.

November –Honorable Chairwoman Frances Charles gave Beatriz permission to provide testimony at the 19th Annual Government-to-Government Violence Against Women Tribal Consultation on November 19-21, 2024 at Santa Fe, New Mexico.

December – It is a short work month but staff was busy assisting victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence and stalking with their emergency needs. Beatriz attended the Inter-Tribal Working Group Training/meeting in Columbia, South Carolina with the help of National Advocacy Center

Happy New Year from the Lower Elwha Housing Authority staff!!

Christmas may be over, but winter will be around for a few more months. Winters can be unpredictable, so be prepared for the coming cold!

- •If you have a fireplace or wood stove check your dampers to make sure they open and close properly. When not in use, keep the damper closed to prevent a draft and heat loss.
- •<u>Test smoke and carbon detectors before firing up the wood burning heat</u> sources and change batteries if needed.
- •Clean up around the exterior of the house, remove any brush and wood near the house to prevent rodent infestations, mice will be looking for a nice place to stay warm and dry.
- •<u>Disconnect hoses from exterior faucets and cover with an insulated faucet/</u>
 <u>spigot cover.</u>

Reminders:

- Recertifications should be completed 60 to 120 days <u>before</u> due date and are a requirement of your lease agreement!!
- Don't forget to update your waiting list file annually.
- Remember to notify us if you change your phone number because communication is essential.

Can food lift your mood?

Holidays can be a stressful time. Studies show that people who eat a healthy diet were less likely to have depression symptoms. This includes:

- Omega 3 fatty foods/ shellfish
- Whole grains
- Nuts
- · Fiber from fruits and veggies
- Adding 'good' bacteria: kefir, yogurt, sauerkraut, garlic and onions.

Did you Know?

Drinking green tea daily may lower your risk of developing heart disease and stroke. Green tea has great antioxidant properties. Enjoy 1-2 c. a day.



- Are you taking your medicine/insulin at the right time? Fast-acting insulin should be taken 15 minutes before the meal and your oral meds at the meal.
- 2. Exercise. Can lower blood sugar 30-50 points in just 10-15 minutes. Exercise makes your muscles more sensitive to insulin and burns carbs.
- 3. Stay hydrated with water. Blood sugars >200 can cause dehydration.
- 4. Choose lower glycemic foods such as oatmeal, beans, whole grains instead of white flour processed food items.
- 5. Eat foods high in Magnesium: dark leafy green, whole grains, fish, dark chocolate.
- Eat foods high in Chromium: egg yolk, whole grains, nuts, green beans, broccoli

Check your blood sugars. "What gets measured gets managed".


